Resource and Waste Separation Collection Calendar

Higashimatsuyama City declared itself a zero-carbon city in November 2025.

Let's promote the 3Rs

① Reduce (Waste reduction)

② Reuse

③ Recycle

- Please strictly follow the rules for separation, disposal, and collection days.
- Clean Station Users should manage and keep it clean.
- Plastic items that cannot be washed or wiped clean (such as small individual packages of soy sauce that come with natto) or plastic items that are stained with oil or mud and cannot be removed should be disposed of as combustible waste.

- Dispose of miscellaneous paper such as tissues, empty snack boxes, and envelopes as recyclables on paper and fabric collection days.
- Please cooperate with the "Mottainai!" campaign and reduce food waste.
- Illegal dumping is a crime. Never do it.

## Garbage that cannot be disposed of at the Clean Station

### Items difficult to process

Please contact retailers or specialized companies.

Gas cylinder, Battery, Tire, Fire extinguisher, Pesticides, chemicals, oil, Construction waste (sliding doors, doors, etc.), tatami, Solar water heater, Car parts, Stone, soil, roof tiles, blocks, Products using CFCs (Fluorocarbon gas), Septic tank blower



### Business Waste

Cannot be put out at Clean Stations.

For general business waste, you can either take it to the Clean Center yourself or ask the city's licensed general waste collection and transportation company to do it for you. For industrial waste, please contact the prefecture's Environmental Management Office.



Please bring them directly to the Clean Center or Nishi-Motojuku Non-burnable Waste Landfill.  
Pruned branches must be up to 15cm in diameter and 2m in length. We will verify your address by checking your driver's license or other identification.

#### [processing fee]

[Household garbage] 25 yen per 10 kg  
However, up to 40 kg can be carried on at one time free of charge as indicated by the weighing scale.  
\*Factions less than 10 yen will be rounded down. (Example) 220 yen for 90 kg

- If you can't carry it yourself  
Please apply for door-to-door collection of bulky household waste (fee apply) at City Hall (Waste Management Division) or at the counter of each CITZer's activity center.

[Application points]

Each household can apply for up to five points per application from the 1st to the 15th of each month (first half) and from the 16th to the last day of each month (second half).

Please apply for collection online. A delivery company will come to you to collect your items. If a computer is included, the collection fee for one box will be free. (The size of one box must be 140cm in total length, width, and height, and weigh up to 20kg.) Peripheral devices such as printers and scanners can also be collected. A data erasure service (fees apply) for personal information is also available.

The method of disposing of lithium-ion batteries etc. will change

### Please separate and dispose of lithium-ion batteries etc. appropriately.

Small rechargeable batteries such as lithium-ion batteries, nickel-cadmium batteries, and nickel-metal hydride batteries have caused fires in garbage trucks and waste disposal facilities.

Do not mix products containing lithium-ion batteries with other non-combustible waste. Place them in a small plastic bag and dispose of them on the day for non-combustible waste collection.

[Points to note when dispose to the clean station]

- ① Dispose in a transparent bag
- ② Do not get the battery wet
- ③ Do not mix with other waste
- ④ Insulate the battery terminals

They are also collected at City Hall (Waste Management Division), the Civic Activity Center, and recycling partner stores such as electronics stores and home improvement stores in the city.



How to dispose of lithium-ion batteries

### Door-to-door collection of household waste for the elderly, and others.

We will come to the homes of elderly people and people with disabilities who have difficulty carrying their own garbage and recyclables to the clean station and who have difficulty getting help from people close to them, in order to reduce the burden on their daily lives.

# Higashimatsuyama City: How to separate and dispose of household

## "recyclables" and "garbage"

**If you separate them, they are resources; if you mix it, it's garbage.**

**Please put them out by 8:30 AM on collection day.**

Plastics with dirt that cannot be removed by washing or wiping should be disposed of as burnable waste, as it hinders recycling.

※Please put items out by category (within the red borders).

※Limit to a maximum of 2 bags (or 2 bundles) of 45L size per category.

※Designated bags from other municipalities cannot be used.

※Please purchase bags (45L or smaller) at retail stores or supermarkets.

※Do not use thin plastic rolls from supermarket registers as trash bags, as they tear very easily.

If metal parts cannot be removed, dispose of the entire item as non-burnable waste.</li> <li>Styrofoam and urethane pillows are plastic waste.</li> </ul>
